District 64 Libertarian Candidate Jason Jordan to Go Door to Door with Constituents

In light of recent political events, Libertarian candidate Jason Jordan has decided to take his campaign directly to the people of District 64.

On August 1, Mr. Jordan received a call from former Republican state representative Suzanna Hupp requesting that he drop his candidacy. It was insinuated (though not promised) that in return for his cooperation, he might receive political favors or perhaps a board position in the near future.

Mr. Jordan declined the offer and vowed to continue his campaign with renewed fervor. Disturbed by this brush with the inner workings of the political machine, however, the 25 year old public school teacher decided to reinvent his campaign style: from now until the election in November, Mr. Jordan will be walking door to door to inform people about his candidacy and positions. His goal is to talk one on one with the voters of District 64, asking them what their concerns are and what they would like to see changed in Austin. Says Jordan, "Too many politicians spend all their time on talking points instead of asking people what matters to them." When asked about the feasibility of walking door to door all day in the current Texas heat, Jordan replied "I'm not worried about the heat, I'm not worried about the weather, because I know what I'm doing is right and that's all that matters."

So far, responses have been mostly positive. When asked to comment on his experiences since beginning his walk on August 4, Mr. Jordan said, "I've been incredibly humbled by the response I've already had. People have invited me into their homes and shared their most pressing concerns. It truly makes me believe that we can change things."
